N ew Year's Day is a special day for Japanese. Many people go to shrines for *Hatsumode* to pray for good health in the year ahead. Drawing fortunes is one of the pleasures of *Hatsumode*. There is also a special New Year's Day meal called *osechi*. These meals are packed in special stacked boxes, and each ingredient has its own meaning.

The Coming-of-Age Day holiday falls on Jan. 13 (Mon./hol.). Although the law was amended in 2022 to lower the age of legal adulthood from 20 to 18, celebrations are often held at age 20 as before. You will see women wearing beautiful kimonos for their coming-ofage ceremonies.


Fantasy of Lights

H appy New Year! In Sapporo, after the start of a new year, many snow candle events are held from late January to February. Protect yourself against the cold and feel the fantasy of candlelight.

Moiwa Ropeway (Chuo-ku, Fushimi 5-3-7) will operate from 5 a.m. to 10 a.m. (last lift at 9:30 a.m.) on New Year's Day, Jan. 1 (Wed./hol.). Ski Area Information

Bankei Ski Area, Mt. Teine, and Kokusai Ski Resort have already opened in December. The price of oneday lift passes for this season for each resort has been raised by between ¥600 to ¥1,600. One-day ticket: (1) Bankei Ski Area: ¥6,300, or ¥5,100 for Hokkaido residents. (2) Mt. Teine: ¥8,200. (3) Mt. Moiwa: ¥4,100 for 7 hours. (4) Kokusai Ski Resort: ¥5,800. Mt. Subways: from Dec. 29 (Sun.) to Jan. 3 (Fri.), subways run from 6 a.m. to midnight on a weekend/holiday schedule.

Banks: closed from Dec. 31 (Tue.) to Jan. 5 (Sun.). ATMs at convenience stores are open 24 hrs.

Post Offices: closed from Dec. 31 (Tue.) to Jan. 5 (Sun.). The central post office (Higashi-ku, Kita 6, Higashi 1) is open every day.

Garbage collection: this is suspended from Jan. 1 (Wed./hol.) to Jan. 3 (Fri.). See the garbage collection calendar that is distributed by the city.
